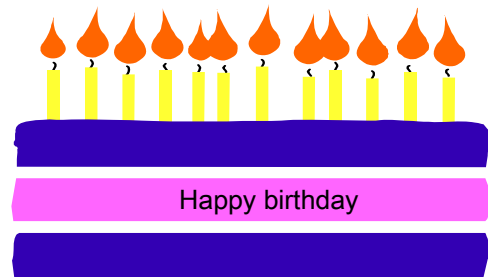

## PLAYING TENNIS WITH SOCRATES AS YOUR PARTNER

The term Socratic Questioning is used to describe a discourse in which an original question is responded to with a question. This in turn forces the first questioner to formulate a new question. In other words, it returns the ball to the server's court. The Socratic teaching method is interactive and allows a teacher to advance his student to progressively advance toward a

logical conclusion.

Some suggest that one of the most difficult tasks a Master Mason may have is answering questions asked by those who are curious about our fraternity.
