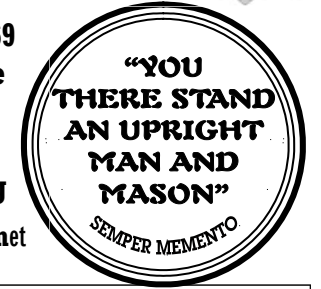

**YOUR SUMMER ASSIGNMENT**

Remember returning to school after Labor Day and receiving an assignment to furnish a report titled, "How I spent My Summer? I sense that reading or listening to those reports was one of the more rewarding parts of a teacher's year.

It has been a few more than fifty-five summers since I turned in my last report. Admittedly this year's summer is just beginning, but I have already completed my first venture and feel compelled to share it early so others might consider duplicating it.

If you take a map of the United States and draw a horizontal line from Reno to the Pacific Ocean it will end on the beach of the Village of Mendocino, California, and if you should travel to that point you will time warp yourself to a place where the tallest building in town is the Masonic Lodge. There are no fast food restaurants and every store is locally owned and operated.

Once your vehicle is parked the whole town of 824 people can we walked from the surf smashing majestic headlands through Victorian lined streets to the driftwood covered beach.

The several eating establishments are friendly and the food is well prepared. I particularly enjoyed a couple of evenings at Patterson's Irish Pub, which serves meals until midnight. If you require chain or big box stores, the larger town of Fort Bragg is about a half hour north on the coastal highway.

There is a wide selection of inns, bed and breakfasts and rental cottages in Mendocino. There is also the vintage majesty of the Mendocino Hotel. My family of eight rented a four bedroom home within earshot of the waves. It was built in 1882, but completely updated inside to include a modern kitchen, three bathrooms a sauna and a hot tub. We visited for five days and never had time or the desire to turn on the TV, DVD or Stereo...Too much else to see and do.

There can be no doubt that the quaintness and allure of the Village is maintained the protection it receives from the 37 miles of sharply twisting "Dramamine" roadway connecting it to inland highway 101, located on the eastern side of the Redwood covered Pacific Mountain Range.

Ours was a five star visit. Contact the local Lodge before you go. The inside is pure artwork.

**Mendocino Lodge No. 179,**  
Mendocino, California

The imposing structure is a Masonic building located at 10500 Lansing Street in Mendocino, California. It was built in 1866 of local redwood by Eric Albertson and John Gschwend. Eric Albertson, who was the first Worshipful Master of Mendocino Lodge No. 179 also crafted from a single redwood trunk the unique sculpture of *Time and the Maiden* which adorns the top of the hall's cupola. Also known as *Father Time and the Virgin*. The sculpture incorporates a book and a fallen column and has become a local landmark. While its exact symbolic meaning is shrouded in Masonic secrecy, one Mason has interpreted its meaning as "*Time, patience and perseverance will accomplish all*".
