THE LOST SYMBOL

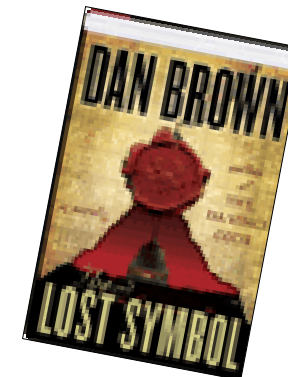
If you are truly a curious Freemason you have already read Dan Brown's DaVinci Code which broke all records for sales when it was published five years ago.
